There will be a consideration of how the European Court of Justice has developed the notion of citizenship and how the evolving law affects issues ranging from human rights to migration. Each morning an expert in the relevant field will address the participants and then matters will be developed through seminar discussion in the afternoon. As a result of the increased numbers, participants will be divided into two groups for the seminar discussions.

## About the European Lawyer Programme

The European Law School (network) was established in 2006 by its three founding members (King's College London, Humboldt University, Berlin, and University Paris 2) in order to establish and develop the European Lawyer programme (the "Juriste Europeen"). Students on this programme pursue undergraduate studies at their home institution for three years and follow that by spending a year at the other founding universities, obtaining a Masters degree at each. During their fourth and fifth years, students concentrate on specialist subject areas. British students spend one year each in Berlin and Paris, German students in London and Paris and French students in Berlin and London.

The central objective of the course of study is to enable students to obtain a deep knowledge and understanding of three separate legal systems in Europe, as well as of European law generally. In this way it will enable them to acquire the skills necessary to practice as a European lawyer in the global environment. It has been agreed that La Sapienza University, Rome, will be joining the network in the next academic year and it is envisaged that other leading European Law schools will do so in the future.

## About the founding Schools

**Humboldt-Universität** was founded just over 150 years ago, and its roll of honour includes luminaries such as Max Planck, Albert Einstein, von Savigny and Hegel. Since von Savigny's era (1779 - 1861). It is one of the leading law schools in Germany. Today the university has an international and interdisciplinary focus. Its views and research are often relied upon by the German legislature and by decision makers at European Union level.

**Université Paris 2** (Panthéon- Assas) is by far the largest law school in France and traditionally is the hub of French legal science. With about 100 professors, the law school offers an extensive range of courses in both national and international law. The school has an established reputation as an innovative leader in French legal education. It is well known for producing graduates who subsequently become leading members of the French legal profession.

**King's College, London** has had a tradition for excellence for over 175 years and is recognised globally as having one of the UK's leading law schools. Located in the heart of London with close links to the legal profession, the school has an international reputation for research in many diverse fields. The School has recently moved into the grade 1 listed Somerset House East Wing building and has been renamed the Dickson Poon School of Law after receiving a large monetary donation from the Hong Kong based philanthropist.
